You have been selected for this class based on your performance and progress in Theatre Arts. The following requirements are mandatory for this class:

- The class is a serious commitment and cannot be taken lightly; this is a production class and expectations are high. Students in the class are expected to demonstrate leadership in grades and behavior.
- All performances and competitions are mandatory and not optional – including the UIL OAP. When you are selected for this class, you are committing to the school and class productions.
- Your participation in the productions is required either as crew or actor. Our dates are posted here and are part of your academic grades. You need to discuss outside school conflicts with your sponsors now. Griffin activities need to be discussed with your sponsor/coach as they arise. Be honest.
- This class gives you opportunities to further develop your skills as a performer. You are expected to act, dance, sing and work in technical theatre. You will work as cast and crew. This is a production class and everyone participates fully in jobs such as set up, strike, costumes, props, build/design/create/paint, and advertisements.
- This class is a competitive environment, but all are expected to support each other. You must be a team player and willing to take smaller jobs and roles with a good attitude.
- You must maintain passing grades in ALL class subjects – a REQUIRED CURRICULUM of the class. Failure to pass will affect your grades and assignments in our class. You must maintain your eligibility: no pass – no play.
- You have been chosen for the class based on your talent, ability, leadership, and behavior that you have demonstrated this year and only a select number fit this high standard of quality.
